




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Pacific Elementary School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for Pacific Elementary School District is \$2,320,631, of which \$1,790,978 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$231,489 is other state funds, \$242,437 is local funds, and \$55,727 is federal funds. Of the \$1,790,978 in LCFF Funds, \$115,316 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

The text description of the above chart is as follows: Pacific Elementary School District plans to spend \$2,125,155 for the 2023-24 school year. Of that amount, \$534,752 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$1,590,403 is not included in the LCAP. 

In 2023-24, Pacific Elementary School District is projecting it will receive \$115,316 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students.
