1. OPENING PROCEDURES FOR OPEN SESSION

- 1.1. Call to Order 4:09 by Zoom meeting.

3. **REPORTS**

- 3.1. Superintendent Report
 - County Superintendent and all District Superintendents are cooperating very closely in Covid-19 response. They have also been coordinating closely with the public health officer of Santa Cruz.
 - Our parking lot internet access, provided by Cruzio, is working, but not all users know how to use it.
 - Most students connected to internet, but some are not. Getting internet to them beyond what we have already done is challenging.
 - Teachers have all stepped up and are shifting to remote instruction, both online and offline.
 - Aides are calling families to support parents and students and to report issues to teachers.
 - Office is able to do most work remotely.
 - California Department of Education has eased most restrictions; Federal Education Department has been less flexible, especially with regards to Special Ed services.
 - FoodLab is serving about 50 meals per day and delivering some to families who cannot come to pick them up. We are required to provide this service but it is losing money.

- Mr. Croll noted that it would be best to have a system that would not be very time-consuming.

6. BOARD RESOLUTIONS

6.1. Resolution 2020-9 Authorization of Closure (K-6)

Approved with no changes. Mr. Croll moved, Ms. Napoles seconded. 2 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 1 absence.

6.2. Resolution 2020-10 Closure of Preschool

Approved with no changes. Mr. Croll moved, Ms. Napoles seconded. 2 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 1 absence.

6.3. Resolution 2020-11 Full Day Kindergarten

- Currently, there is funding available, but construction funds have been delayed
- FDK = 4 hrs/day (not including recess). Does it include lunchtime? Per the state, FDK is > 4 hours of *instructional* time, so excluding lunch & recess. However, it looks like your kinder program is 8:40-12:30, so even if that was all instructional time, it would be less than 4 hours and considered part time kindergarten.
- Capacity: We have an existing classroom that currently houses our K class. We also have an existing room that currently houses preschool. I want the classes to switch locations for various reasons. The current PK (future K) room is very old, dilapidated, and no longer code compliant. I want to tear it down and build a new FDK classroom. Is this possible using FDK funds? Yes, this scenario is possible using FDK funds, as long as the new kinder classroom is not portable.
- New construction vs Retrofit: in the above scenario, I want to demolish the current PK/future K building. Then it would be considered new construction, correct? I believe the existing building is too dilapidated to be retrofitted. If you are replacing an existing classroom, it is technically going to be considered a 'retrofit' since there is no new capacity being added (even though the classrooms will obviously be built new).
- Hardship: prior to applying for Prop 51 funds, we started setting aside money in Fund 14 (or 21), then we were told we had to use that as a match. Is it the same for FDK? Would it be better not to put money in Funds 14 or 21? Yes, the review and determination for financial hardship status will be similar to the review that you went through previously.
- FRPM: our rate is well below 60%; usually we are around 33%. This will result in fewer preference points, but there is hopefully enough funding in this round for many districts with lower FRPM rates to receive funding.

Approved with no changes. Mr. Croll moved, Ms. Napoles seconded. 2 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 1 absence.

Approved with no changes. Mr. Croll moved, Ms. Napoles seconded. 2 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 1 absence.

7. ITEMS TO BE TRANSACTED AND/OR DISCUSSED

- 7.1. Approval of Board Policies, Administrative Regulations, Board Bylaws, & Exhibits
 - BP &AR 5141.21 administering Medication And Monitoring Health Conditions
 - Mr. Gross noted that other schools passed this BP and AR but don't give meds w/o written permission or when staff does not feel prepared to do so.

Approved BP and AR with no changes. Mr. Croll moved, Ms. Napoles seconded. 2 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 1 absence.

• Choose Gamut or Small School Districts Association for BPs Gamut and CSBA provide very comprehensive policy recommendations. SSDA provides much simpler, fewer, minimal legally required policy recommendations. The Board requested more information about this possible transition.

7.2. Preschool Revenue During Shut Down

We are funded by parent tuition, a county grant, and the state grant. The county and state have both tentatively indicated that they will probably continue to pay us this year. We have carryover in the preschool fund which should cover us for this year. However, the county and state's budgets are likely to be worse and we may lose part or all of those funding sources in the future. In addition, there may be fewer families able or willing to pay for tuition-based preschool.

Mr. Croll suggested that we ask our anonymous Teacher Enhancement Grant donor for more flexibility.

Ms. Andrews reported on preschool enrollment projections for next year, and some of the other sources of financial uncertainty.

- 7.3. Budget Development for 2020-21 Fiscal Year
 - Identify areas for potential cost savings

The Board briefly reviewed a list of possible budget cuts prepared by Ms. Andrews. Mr. Croll recommended that Mr. Gross and Ms. Andrews prioritize the list. The Board is in favor of creating a tiered approach with certain levels of cuts that accomplish certain percentage changes in the budget.

7.4. Succession Planning in case Board or Superintendent are unable to perform duties

Mr. Gross suggested hiring Brenda Payne, Kathy Howard, or Kris Stanga in the event that he is unable to do his job duties.
