3. **REPORTS**

- 3.1. Superintendent Report
- Instead of submitting a three-year LCAP on July 1, districts will submit an update of COVID-19 related impacts on students and plans to address those impacts. In the fall, districts and charter schools will work with stakeholders on abbreviated one-year LCAPs, with a deadline of December 15 for submission. The deadline for approval by a county superintendent or State Superintendent Thurmond is January 14, 2021.
- Executive order also waives required physical education minutes, physical fitness testing, spring administration of the proficiency examination, and the summative English proficiency testing window to allow for an optional administration for reclassification purposes. Academic assessments were previously waived under a separate order.
- New law (AB21) for filing claims for sexual abuse (retroactive). Claims already filed against SELF JPA means our cost for membership increases, and could go up a lot if there are many claims against any member of the JPA.

 - Report on effects of closure on students instead of LCAP
 - Parent Survey results overall, parents are fairly satisfied with the way Pacific School has handled distance learning
 - Possible Back-to-School Scenarios for 2020-21. The superintendents of Santa Cruz County are planning for different scenarios from 100% distance learning through some degree of restrictions to back to normal. The most likely is somewhere in the middle.

Agreed to vote on all of the above BPs and ARs as a bundle. Ms. Napoles moved, Mr. Croll seconded. 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 0 absences. Approved all of the listed BPs and ARs with no changes. Ms. Napoles moved, Mr. Croll seconded. 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 0 absences.

• Gamut vs. Small School Districts Association for BPs Carl Corbin strongly recommends Gamut from a legal point of view. Having BPs is more defensible, clarifies questions, provides guidance, is timely, & they have strong legal team vetting and drafting BPs. We could search other LEA's BPs and copy and paste, but that is time consuming. Up to LEA to decide whether saving \$4,000 is worth legal exposure. In light of this advice, the Board decided to make no change.

7.2. Auditor Selection

Approved with no changes. Ms. Napoles moved, Mr. Croll seconded. 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 0 absences.

7.3. Declarations of Need for Teachers

We do not anticipate having trouble hiring fully credentialed teachers. Approved with no changes. Ms. Napoles moved, Mr. Croll seconded. 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 0 absences.

7.4. Homeschool Program

- Create a 100% distance education program for 2020-21 with BDSD
- The homeschool program would serve students from both districts (and potentially other districts in the area) who don't feel safe returning to physical campus
- Depending on interest level, enroll on current IS rosters or hire new teacher

Following discussion, approved with no changes. Ms. Napoles moved, Mr. Croll seconded. 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 0 absences.

- 7.5. Preschool Budget, Personnel, and Quality of Education
 - County & State continuing funding this year; no tuition currently being paid
 - One preschool teacher retiring at end of year will save money next year
 - The Board discussed potential scenarios for serving preschool students while meeting social distancing requiring requirements. It is challenging to meet all of the following constraints: budget, social distancing, licensing requirements. It is possible to meet 2 out of 3 more easily. We may want to use the multiuse room for preschool programs.
- 7.6. Budget for 2020-21 Fiscal Year
 - Based on the May Revise, the COE is telling us to plan for 10% budget cuts.
 - The Board discussed a spreadsheet of proposed budget cuts. The Board did not make any decisions at this time.

- 7.8. Pacific Collegiate School Petition to Expand to 6th-grade The Board discussed their opposition to this proposed expansion. The Board agreed to empower Board President Rhabyt to write and send a letter endorsing the points raised by Scotts Valley and opposing this expansion to 6th grade by PCS because of its negative impacts on Pacific School's enrollment. Approved as described. Ms. Napoles moved, Mr. Croll seconded. 3 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstentions, 0 absences.
